

Biography - Sven Stevenson (DNB, The Netherlands)

Sven Stevenson is Senior Advisor on Deposit Insurance at the Resolution Department at De Nederlandsche Bank (DNB). Mr. Stevenson joined the organization in 2009. He is an expert on deposit insurance and bank resolution, with broad experience in the area of policy development.



Within The Netherlands, he led the development of the framework for the new Dutch deposit guarantee scheme which entered into force in late 2015. On behalf of DNB, he was responsible for negotiations on – and the implementation of – the re-cast of the DGS Directive. Since 2015, he actively contributes to discussion on a common European Deposit Insurance Scheme. Under his leadership, a stand-alone deposit guarantee system was introduced in the Caribbean Netherlands in 2017.

In 2013, Mr. Stevenson chaired the workstream on DGS with the European Banking Authority (EBA), which at the time was chartered with the development of methodologies for risk based contributions. Since 2017, he is a member of IADI's Core Principles and Research Committee (CPRC) and the EU Management Executive of the European Forum of Deposit Insurers (EFDI).

In 2014, Mr. Stevenson was seconded to the Financial Crisis Preparedness and Management Department within the IMF (Washington, D.C.) where he worked on issues related to cross-border bank resolution and resolution funding. During his tenure at the IMF, he also contributed to the update of the IADI Core Principles. From 2014 to 2016, Mr. Stevenson coordinated all IMF-related affairs within DNB.

Before joining De Nederlandsche Bank, Mr. Stevenson worked for the Dutch Ministry of Finance, the Dutch Ministry of Infrastructure, the Dutch Labour party and in the banking sector for ABN AMRO. He holds a MSc in Economics from the University of Amsterdam and a Post Master's degree in Applied Financial and Economic Policy from the Erasmus University Rotterdam.
